

**Record of Proceedings
Coshocton City Council
Meeting Held: October 28, 2013**

The regular session of the Coshocton City Council was called to order at 7:00 pm by Council President Cliff Biggers, Council Members present were: Mr. Bob Fetters, Mr. Jim Baker, Mrs. Jackie Salmans, Mr. Brad Fuller, Mr. Tom Edwards, Mr. Cliff Biggers, Mr. Tom Grier and Mr. Glenn Mishler. Also present Mr. Steve Mercer, Mayor; Mr. Jerry Stenner, Safety Service Director and Ms. Cherry Wilson, Clerk.

Previous Meeting Minutes: President Biggers confirmed that all council members had received the minutes from October 15th. Tom Grier made a motion to accept the minutes as presented, seconded by Jim Baker. After a roll call vote all members voted yes.

City Officers Report:

Mayor's Report: Mayor Mercer announced the signs have been ordered for Roscoe Village. They are to make people aware of the steep grade. One will be placed by the cemetery caution steep grade check brakes with an advised speed limit of 15 mph and will have flashing LED lights around it. Signs cautioning steep grade check brakes will be in multiple locations. Mayor Mercer stressed the 15 mph speed is a suggested safety speed it does not change the speed limit in the area. The Mayor also reminded everyone we can't prevent accidents but we can make people aware of the dangerous grade they are on.

Service Director's Report: Mr. Stenner reported the street department has started picking up a few leaves by the school. It is tradition to start in that area to test the equipment. They will then go through all 6 zones. If weather permits one additional sweep will be made in all zones. This is the last week to get hot mix for patching pot holes. The street department is trying to get the pot holes repairs wrapped up for this season.

Legislation at first reading:

48-13 appropriations. After the first reading Jackie Salmans made the motion to suspend the rules and give the ordinance a second reading seconded by Tom Edwards, all members voted

yes. After the second reading Tom Grier made the motion to suspend the rules and give the ordinance a third reading seconded by Jim Baker, all members voted yes. After the third reading all members voted yes. Ordinance 48-13 passed with the emergency clause.

49-13 transfers. President Biggers announced the Agenda had a typographical error and the actual number of the ordinance is 49-13. After the first reading Tom Grier made the motion to suspend the rules and give the ordinance a second reading seconded by Glenn Mishler, all members voted yes. After the second reading Glenn Mishler made the motion to suspend the rules and give the ordinance a third reading seconded by tom Edwards, all members voted yes. After the third reading all members voted yes. Ordinance 49-13 passed with the emergency clause.

Resolutions:




Unfinished Business: None
