

**Record of Proceedings
Coshocton City Council
Meeting Held: July 14, 2014**

The regular session of the Coshocton City Council was called to order at 7:00 pm by Council President Cliff Biggers, Council Members present were: Mr. Jim Baker, Ms. Jackie Salmans, Mr. Brad Fuller, Mr. Bob Pell, Mr. Cliff Biggers, Mr. Tom Grier and Mr. Glenn Mishler. Tom Grier made the motion to excuse Mr. Bob Fetters, seconded by Jim Baker. All members voted yes. Also present Mr. Steve Mercer, Mayor and Ms. Cherry Wilson, Clerk. Mr. Jerry Stenner, Safety Service Director was absent.

Previous Meeting Minutes: President Biggers confirmed that all council members had received the minutes from June 23, 2014. Tom Grier made the motion to accept the minutes as submitted seconded by Glenn Mishler. After a roll call vote all members voted yes.

Petitions & Remonstrance's: Mayor Mercer introduced the Coshocton is Blooming representatives. He thanked them all for the terrific amount of work that was done in the city. Debra Wallace from CIB said they will receive the report from the judges around the first of October when the symposium is held in Philadelphia. Five special mentions awards were given by judges while they were here. Debra Wallace presented those: Terry and Ann Miller, Kervin Williams, The Oaks, Knob Hill Design and the Coshocton County Courthouse restoration project.

John Brady of 1416 Dehart Avenue expressed concern about the bridge on SR541/Chestnut Street being covered in poison ivy. He also stated that on Orange Street around D&D Construction and that area had no sidewalks and no walk ways.

City Officers Report:

Mayor's Report: Mayor Mercer announced he and Utilities Director, Dave McVay had attended the Lean Ohio Boot Camp last week. It was a week long course in Canton sponsored by the State of Ohio. It was to identify ways to improve methods currently used in all areas, with the goal of learning principles on lean methodology and teaching a different process of looking at things. He and Dave both agreed it was very worthwhile and both felt it was a benefit to attend. Both of the approximately \$2,000 tuitions were paid by a grant from the state.

Law Director's Report: Bob Skelton was present May and June reports were distributed to council.

Sheriff's Office Report: Lt. Hettinger was present with no report.

Fire Chief's Report: Chief Layton was present with no report.

Auditors Report: Auditor Sherry Kirkpatrick asked council to approve and accept the Detailed Check Report dated 6/18/14 & 7/02/14, Then and Now's dated 6/18/14 & 7/02/14 and the Cash Statement dated 6/30/14. Jackie Salmans made the motion to approve and accept, seconded by Bob Pell. All members voted yes.

Treasurer's Report: Absent

Utilities Department Report: Director Dave McVay was present with no report.

Income Tax Department Report: Administrator Jackie Cushman was present and June's Reports were distributed.

Public Works Department Report: Director Jim Ruby was present. Reported crews are busy continuing to work on catch basins and culverts. He is also looking at ways to improve the condition of Otsego Avenue until it can hopefully be paved next year.

Introduction of Ordinances:

Mr. Biggers announced a correction to the agenda. Ordinance 23-14 was titled incorrect. The correct title is appropriations.

Legislation at first reading:

21-14 an ordinance authorizing the mayor to purchase a new fully equipped vehicle to be used by the Coshocton County Sheriff's Office. After discussion from Tom Grier regarding tracking VIN's from the automobiles purchased by the city to ensure we receive the correct vehicles back after they are retired from the Sheriff's Office, Brad Fuller made the motion to suspend the rules and give the ordinance a second reading, seconded by Glenn Mishler, all members voted yes. After the second reading Jackie Salmans made a motion to suspend the rules and give the ordinance a third reading, seconded by Jim Baker, all members voted yes. After the third reading all members voted yes. Ordinance 21-14 was passed with the emergency clause.

22-14 appropriations. Tom Grier made the motion to suspend the rules and give the ordinance a second reading, seconded by Bob Pell, all members voted yes. After the second reading Bob Pell made a motion to suspend the rules and give the ordinance a third reading, seconded by Jackie Salmans, all members voted yes. After the third reading all members voted yes. Ordinance 22-14 was passed with the emergency clause.

23-14 appropriations. Jackie Salmans made the motion to suspend the rules and give the ordinance a second reading, seconded by Bob Pell, all members voted yes. After the second reading Tom Grier made a motion to suspend the rules and give the ordinance a third reading, seconded by Brad Fuller, all members voted yes. After the third reading all members voted yes. Ordinance 23-14 was passed with the emergency clause.

Legislation at second reading:

20-14 an ordinance to establish new fund #225 Street Levy Fund. Ordinance to take its course.

Legislation at third reading:

17-14 an ordinance establishing tree rules and regulations for the City of Coshocton. After the third reading all members voted yes. Ordinance 17-14 passed.

18-14 an ordinance adopting the budget of the City of Coshocton, Ohio, for the fiscal year beginning January 2015, and submitting same to the County Auditor. After the third reading all members voted yes. Ordinance 18-14 passed.

New Business: None

Communications: The clerk read a letter addressed to council from Kitty Exline, President of Blue Star Mothers. Ms. Exline thanked council for the recognition shown to her son SFC Bradley Exline Sr. at the June 9th council meeting.

Brad Fuller gave the report on an active military member from Coshocton. Master Sergeant Stubbs was born and raised in Coshocton, Ohio and attended River View High School where he was active in track & field and Scouting. MSgt Stubbs enlisted in the Marine Corps Delayed Entry Program during his senior year and graduated in 1989. While waiting to ship to Boot Camp following high school, MSgt Stubbs was employed at Longaberger Construction Company (Longaberger Baskets, Dresden, OH).

Private Stubbs reported to recruit training at Parris Island, SC in December 1989, and upon graduation, attended Marine Combat Training (MCT) at Camp Lejeune, NC. Following MCT, Pvt Stubbs was assigned to the Marine Detachment at Chanute Air Force Base, IL as a Marine Weather Observer student. Private First Class (PFC) Stubbs graduated from his primary Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) School in June 1990 and was assigned to the Fleet Marine Force in Okinawa, Japan.

In August 1990, PFC Stubbs reported for duty at Marine Wing Support Squadron (MWSS) 172, Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) Futenma, and immediately received Fleet Assistance Program (FAP) orders to Headquarters & Headquarters Squadron (H&HS). During his two years on Okinawa, he was de-FAPed back to MWSS-172 on several occasions to support local exercises, deployments to Korea, and in anticipation of deploying for Operation Desert Shield and Desert Storm. He was meritoriously promoted to Corporal in March 1992 and held the billets of Watch Leader, Quality Control NCO, and Meteorological Mobile Facility NCOIC.

Cpl Stubbs was assigned to MWSS-271 at Marine Corps Auxiliary Landing Facility (MCALF) Bogue Field, NC in August 1992 where he would hold the billets of Watch Leader, Quality Control NCO, Supply NCO; and as the senior Observer, Sgt Stubbs was heavily involved in the testing and implementation of new weather computers and equipment. Sgt Stubbs was honorably discharged in December 1993, and proceeded to join his wife and children at Ft. Campbell, KY where she was assigned to the 101st Airborne Division as a US Air Force Weather Forecaster.

Upon his transition from active duty service-member to active duty service member's spouse, Sgt Stubbs began drilling with a Select Marine Corps Reserve (SMCR) unit in Lexington, KY and attending college at night. Sgt Stubbs made a lateral move to the Military Police (MP) community when he joined MP Company A, 4th FSSG in Lexington, and subsequently attended and graduated from MP school at Ft. McClellan, AL in October 1994. Sgt Stubbs received an Associate's degree (with distinction) from the University of Kentucky's Hopkinsville Community College in the fall of 1996.

When his wife executed Permanent Change of Station (PCS) orders from the 101st Airborne to another Army-support billet with the 1st Armored Cavalry at Ft. Hood, TX in November 1996, Sgt Stubbs executed an inter-unit transfer to MWSS-471 in Fort Worth, TX, and returned to the Weather community as the unit's Weather Service Chief. While with MWSS-471, Sgt Stubbs participated in several Combined Arms Exercises (CAX) at Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center (MCAGCC) Twentynine Palms, CA, and augmented MCAS Cherry Point's Provost Marshall's Office.

In June 2000, the Stubbs family executed PCS orders from Ft. Hood to the Pentagon, and Staff Sgt Stubbs transferred to MWSS-474 at NAS Willow Grove, PA. While with that unit, SSgt Stubbs completed forecasting school and earned an additional MOS; and also continued to work towards his civilian education, attending night classes at George Mason University in Fairfax, VA. Following the events of Sept 11th, SSgt Stubbs was recalled to active duty and sent to Marine Forces Pacific Headquarters in Hawaii as the Meteorology & Oceanographic (METOC) Chief on the Commanding General's Staff within the Intelligence Section. SSgt Stubbs also augmented the Weather Office at Marine Corps Air Facility (MCAF) Quantico, VA during his time in the Northern-Virginia area. Gunnery Sgt Stubbs' reserve unit was activated and deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) II in 2004. He remained on active duty through 2005 when he transferred to the Individual Ready Reserve (IRR) and joined his family in Japan who had executed orders to Misawa Air Base while he was deployed in Iraq.

GySgt Stubbs divorced in 2008, and in July of that year was recalled to active duty and deployed as an individual augment to 3d Marine Aircraft Wing (MAW) as the G-2 (Intelligence Section) METOC Chief in support of OIF 8. Following his redeployment to MCAS Miramar in San Diego, CA from the Tactical Air Command Center (TACC) at Al Asad, Iraq; GySgt Stubbs attended Weapons and Tactics Instructor (WTI) Course 2-09 at Marine Aviation Weapons and Tactics Squadron One (MAWTS-1) in Yuma, AZ, and became the second enlisted METOC Marine to ever graduate from the course. GySgt Stubbs began the process of transferring back to the Marine Corps' active component from the Reserves while augmenting 3d MAW; and in September of 2009, his request came back approved from Headquarters Marine Corps. Upon reenlisting back into the active component, GySgt Stubbs resumed the 3d MAW METOC Chief billet as permanent personnel rather than as an individual augment. GySgt Stubbs would deploy once again with the MAW Staff, this time to the TACC at Camp Leatherneck, Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) 10 from July of 2010 until February of 2011.


MSgt Stubbs was promoted to his present rank in August of 2011 and immediately executed Permanent Change of Assignment orders to Marine Air Control Squadron 1, Air Traffic Control Detachment B, MCAS Miramar, as the detachment's METOC Chief. While with MACS-1 Det B, MSgt Stubbs would again deploy to Afghanistan in support of OEF 12, serve as a WTI Augment Instructor at MAWTS-1, and complete multiple field exercises with the unit. He also served as the unit's Senior Enlisted Advisor from August 2013 until June 2014 when he received


Permanent Change of Station orders to MCAS Cherry Point, NC, where he is currently serving as the METOC Chief within the Intelligence Section at the 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing Headquarters.

MSgt Stubbs personal awards include: 3 Meritorious Masts, 3 Certificates of Commendation, Letter of Commendation, Navy & Marine Corps Achievement Medal, and Navy & Marine Corps Commendation Medal.
